Curtis Cadman Graduate Studentship Award Competition - 2007

The Children's Health Research Institute is pleased to announce its request for applications for the 2007 Curtis Cadman Graduate Studentship Award Competition.

The Curtis Cadman Graduate Studentship Award was created at the Children's Health Research Institute to support graduate students to conduct research in paediatric genetic disorders. This studentship has been established through the generosity of the Cadman family. The Cadman family raises funds through an annual Walkathon in memory of Curtis Cadman who had a rare genetic disorder. These funds have been donated to the Children's Health Foundation to be used to support genetic research at CHRI.

Guidelines for Applicants:

1. The trainee's primary supervisor must hold an appointment as a Children's Health Research Institute Scientist or Associate Scientist.
2. A graduate student awarded the Curtis Cadman Graduate Studentship in 2006 may apply to this competition. However, the award will not necessarily be renewed.
3. Graduate students must be conducting research in paediatric genetic disorders.
4. A completed application must be submitted along with the request for support.
5. The maximum allowable request for funding is one year.
